The proposition to refer the entire matter to a sub-committee and to report to the joint committee later did not meet with favor and has been abandoned.

## THE CITY WATER TODAY

Subjoined is today's official report of the condition of the city water, in connection with which the city water works and sewerage board authorizes the following statement:

It is from the viewpoint of health that pure water brings its largest financial returns. The coincident drop in typhoid fever rates with an improvement in the water supply, has been observed in hundreds of instances. It is very difficult to estimate the cost per case, but statistics available seem to indicate the actual expenditures of about \$2200 for each death. Pure water has evidently a very beneficial effect upon disease diarrhoeal in nature, and probably also engenders an increased vitality that assists in the resistance to other diseases not water-borne.
