ALARM SYSTEM IS BEING INSTALLED

Private Telephone Stations to Be Established in East and West Ends.

Another civic improvement is being added to the many that have been marking the administration of Mayor Will H. Cole. This is the installation of a long needed fire and police alarm system.

As a starter, alarm stations are being established in the East End and in the West End, and if they prove useful others will be added later on.

Station No. 1 is to be at a telephone pole on East Main street opposite the White House hotel and Station No. 2 is to be on a pole in front of Angle Inn. They are iron boxes containing private telephones connecting with the Bell system with special arrangements for the immediate call of either the fire or police departments. The telephones for the present are for the use of the policemen. They are to make regular reports over them to police headquarters.

In the case a fire breaks out, or police reinforcements are needed in a hurry, these alarm stations will effect a great and perhaps valuable saving of time.
