NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR SPECIAL MUNICIPAL LEVY. To the qualified voters of the town of Lumberport, West Virginia.

TAKE NOTICE THAT, at a legal session of the council of Lumberport, West Virginia, held on the 12th day of August, 1913, the following order was regularly adopted and entered of record, to-wit:

This council is of the opinion that the maximum rate of levy allowed by law for municipal purposes, will not produce sufficient funds for the current fiscal year and for the year 1914 to cover the expenditures for the said two years in the town, and that additional funds will be needed for specific purposes, the amount thereof for each purpose, together with the total as follows:
Regular estimate, \$1405.41.

Special Levy 1913-14. For rights of way for new street connecting west end of county bridge with Main street in said town.

Total additional fund needed, \$1705.41.

And this council having ascertained that the aggregate amount of taxable property on which it is authorized to levy is \$405,821 and that the rate of levy in cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100) of valuation of such property necessary to produce the said distinct amount estimated to be needed is 20 cents; it is hereby ordered by this council that according to the provisions of section 5 and 7 of chapter 3 of the Acts of the Legislature of 1904, the question shall be first submitted to a vote of the people of said town of Lumberport, at a special election to be held for the purpose of determining whether or not this council shall levy a special levy of 20 cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100) of the taxable property as aforesaid, for the years 1913 and 1914 to raise said additional funds, and if it is ordered that said special election shall be held on the 15th day of September, 1913, between sunrise and sunset at the regular voting places in said town, notice of which, including this order, shall be published and posted according to the provisions of section 7 of chapter 3 of the Acts of 1904, and the recorder is hereby authorized to prepare, procure and furnish to the election commissioners at each place of voting in said town the tickets, poll books, tally sheets and other things needed to hold said election; which election shall be held and conducted in all other respects according to law. And it is further ordered that the ballot used in said election shall have printed thereon as a caption the following:

"Special election to authorize a special levy of 20 cents for the year 1913 and for the year 1914, according to the order of the Common Council of the Town of Lumberport, entered on the 12th day of August, 1913, to raise additional funds for municipal purposes."

And, also directly underneath the foregoing caption in two separate lines shall be printed the words:

"FOR THE LEVY"
