THE CITY WATER TODAY

Subjoined is today's official report of the condition of the city water, in connection with which the city water works and sewerage board authorizes the following statement:

The combating of typhoid fever may be divided into two stages, first, getting rid of the typhoid due to a polluted water supply, and second, combating the so-called residual or contact fever. Many cities have not progressed as far as the first stage—that of providing a pure water supply.

Following is today's test for fever and other germs as made by Perkins & Roynton.

At a regular session of the town council of North View, held August 19th, 1913, at 7:30 o'clock p. m., the following ordinance was adopted:

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SIDEWALKS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF NORTH VIEW:
SECTION I. All persons or corporations owning a lot or lots, within the corporate limits of the town of North View, abutting on any street or road thereof, shall construct a sidewalk not less than four (4) feet in width, of lumber, brick or cement, along the street or road, for the entire distance which such lot or lots shall abut upon such street or roads, within 30 days from passage of this ordinance, and shall thereafter maintain and keep such sidewalk in good repair; Provided, however, that where a sufficient sidewalk is already constructed along such lot or lots, at the present time, the same may remain until further notice is given to the property owner.

SECTION II. Whenever, in the opinion of the Council, the pavement of any sidewalk shall need repairs, the Superintendent of Streets shall give at least ten (10) days' notice to the owner of the property in front of which such sidewalk is located, to make the necessary repairs, and if such owner shall not make the required repairs within the time limited in said notice, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent of Streets to cause the same to be done at the expense of the Town and file with the recorder of the Town a statement of such expenses plus 10 per cent additional and the Council shall assess the amount of such expenses upon the owner of such property and require the same to be collected by the Town Sargent in the manner provided by law for the collection of taxes.

SECTION III. If any property owner shall fail or refuse to construct sidewalks in front of his property as required by Section I of this Ordinance, within the time therein required, it shall be the duty of the Street Committee to cause such sidewalks to be made upon the most reasonable terms and to furnish an itemized account of the expenses of the construction of such sidewalks. Thereupon, it shall be the duty of the Council to assess the amount of such expenses upon the owner of such property and require the same to be collected by the Town Sargent in the manner provided by law for the collection of taxes.

SECTION IV. Whenever, in the opinion of the Council, or of the Mayor, or Superintendent of Streets, the pavement or any sidewalk shall need cleaning, the Street Committee shall give the owner, agent or occupant of the real property next adjacent thereto at least one day's notice requiring such sidewalk to be cleaned and if the owner, agent or occupant of such property shall not clean such pavement in the manner and within the time prescribed in said notice, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent of Streets to cause the same to be done, and the amount of such expense shall be reported and assessed in the manner of similar expense as provided in the preceding section.

SECTION V. All sidewalks shall be of uniform grade with the street or road and shall rise from the curbstone or water table if at any, at an angle of one-half inch in every foot in the width thereof.

SECTION VI. All curbstones used for securing pavements on the sidewalks shall be of the following dimensions, viz: At least four feet long, at least five inches thick and at least twenty inches deep unless for good and sufficient reasons, the Council shall otherwise order at the time, and the said curbstones shall be so set as to show at least four inches above the ground on the side next to the street or alley with any hereby repealed.

SECTION VII. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VIII. This ordinance shall be in effect on and after its date of passage.

SECTION IX. Notice to property owners to construct sidewalks as required by Section I of this Ordinance shall be given by causing to be issued a notice to be published in two issues each of the Clarksburg Exponent and the Clarksburg Telegram.
