### POLICEWOMAN'S COSTUME.

Uniform of Blue Is Simple, Yet Distinguished and Odd.  
The uniform worn by the policewomen of Chicago is unique and easily distinguished from the costumes worn by other women. The female officers carry neither a billet nor a pistol.

**POLICEWOMAN IN UNIFORM.**  
Their dress consists of a vest, skirt and half length coat. The material is blue. The vest, buttoned down the front, is tight and fits close around the neck. The skirt is perfectly plain, with the exception of a hem at the bottom. The coat is likewise plain.

The officers are provided with a bag, which is attached to the belt. This takes the place of a hand bag. The hat is very different from those worn by civilians. Plummage and other ornaments are barred.

The policewomen in Chicago have been on duty long enough to demonstrate their worth to the city. They are especially active in protecting members of their own sex, and their beats are usually around some public amusement place or dance hall where young girls congregate, frequently unescorted.
