## THE THEATERS

One of the most important social and musical events of the season will be the beautiful, bright, catchy Chinese musical comedy, "San Toy," in two acts which will be given at the Robinson Grand theater Monday evening, February 2, under the auspices of the Marcato Music Club. One of the leading characters "Li," a Chinaman who has traveled, was originally played by James T. Powers. Li will be well impersonated by Ralph Stager. To appreciate him one must see him in the "En De Cologne" scene, and drilling the Emperor's Guards. Sir Blingo Preston (Lisle Powell) makes a very fine fussy old Englishman. He tries very hard to get off jokes on the Chinese but they don't see it. Capt. Bobby Preston, son of Sir Blingo (Martin Welsh) who falls in love with San Toy makes a very good lover. He has a very sweet voice. His solo, "Lotus Land," is sure to be one of the hits of the evening. Lieut. Harvey Tucker (Duke Wells) is a great favorite here. He has a beautiful voice, a good stage presence and gives a very good impersonation of the Lieutenant the emperor, (William Shinn), with all his wives and is very zealously guarded by six beautiful Amazons, but with all the guarding he manages to fall in love with San Toy. He has some funny situations and he surely makes the most of them. Yen How (Dr. Herbert Atchison) a mandarin of high cast, the father of San Toy, who takes himself very seriously with his six little wives is bound to make a decided hit. Fo Hop (Glen Norman) who is also in love with San Toy is very good in the scene where he denounces Yen How for palming San Toy off to the emperor as a boy and not a girl. Sing Hi (George Thompson), Hu Pi (John Strother), Li Hi (Albert Bartlett), and Li Ho (Fred Johnson), are all very good in their respective parts. The chorus is very strong, one of the very best choruses ever given by a home talent play in Clarksburg.
