PYTHIANS

Are Making Great Gains in Membership in the State of West Virginia.

KINGWOOD Feb. 13.—Samuel B. Montgomery, Grand Keeper of Records and Seals of the State of West Virginia gave out an interesting statement this morning. He said:

"The Knights of Pythias made a gain of 1,490 members for the year of 1913, this being the largest gain made in the forty-four years of the history of the order in this state. Our gain for 1912 was 821. We now have 184 lodges with 16,250 members. At the present rate of increase our membership will reach twenty thousand by June 30, 1914.

"The subordinate lodges have over one hundred thousand dollars in cash on hand with assets in stocks and bonds and other investments aggregating another two hundred thousand dollars.

"Grand lodge finances are on a sound basis and we have over sixty thousand dollars in cash in the hands of the treasurer of the Pythian Home fund.

"The first lodge on West Virginia soil was instituted at Martinsburg, Berkeley county, April 6, 1869, with eighteen charter members.

"The Rev. William Gerhardt, D. D., was the prime spirit in securing a dispensation to institute the lodge which was named Washington Lodge No. 1, in honor of General Washington. He thus became the founder of West Virginia Pythianism. It is delightful to say that Father Gerhardt is still living, having reached the age of 98 years on October 28, 1913. His mind remains clear and his vision unobscured.

"The Grand Lodge of West Virginia was organized at Berkeley Springs, Morgan county, on July 4, 1868. At that time we had six lodges and two hundred and thirty-four members.

"The order was founded on February 19, 1864, in the city of Washington when Washington Lodge No. 1 was instituted by Justus Henry Rathbone, the founder of the order. We began then with one subordinate lodge and five members, we now have 7,384 subordinate lodges with upwards of 750,000 members.

"The Supreme Lodge as it now exists, was organized August 11, 1868.

"The Knights of Pythias enters the fiftieth period of its existence with the growth and influence, unprecedented in the history of fraternal benevolent societies of America."


