THE THEATERS

The boys will be turned over to Mr. Smeltzer by the Telegram at 7 o'clock promptly and he will take them through California from its southern confines to the world famed Yosemite National Park in the far north passing all the principal cities and points of interest and then he will take them on the South Pacific expedition to the South Pacific Islands to the wild game haunts and show them the daring of the foreign photographers among the great herd of saucy elephants which is the only living herd on earth. They will cruise to the islands of Santa Cruz and Anacapa off the coast of Santa Barbara where they will visit the greatest seal rookeries on the Pacific coast, and where they will watch thousands of seals, old and young, at play in their native haunts and millions of sea birds of all kinds and descriptions. They will visit in Los Angeles and San Francisco, and go to the San Jacinto mountains where they will see thousands of ostriches with their young being rounded up on the mountain ranges of California, and to the wild duck marshes where they will witness the most spectacular film ever made, that of wild duck shooting at sunrise. They will see hundreds of

scenes that have made this picture famous throughout the world and Mr. Smeltzer will have them back to Clarksburg in two hours, which time is required to show the entire seven reels.

These pictures will undoubtedly be given a great reception in Clarksburg as their fame reached here before them from Wheeling and the larger cities of the country. The Wheeling newspapers state that during their play of last week at the Court theater standing room was at a premium and hundreds of people were turned away the last two days. In addition to the newsboys the Daily Telegram will make it possible for all orphans and poor children of the city to witness the production. If some of our citizens know of such cases and will assist in getting them to the theater at any of the performances to be given here.

Wednesday is Famous Players Film Company day and the big attraction will be Mary Pickford in "A Good Little Devil." The Hearst-Selig weekly will also be shown.

A most refreshing contribution to the season's theatrical attractiveness will be found in Mrs. Fiske's presentation of "Mrs. Bumpstead-Leigh," which is to be given at the Robinson Grand

Thursday evening. The play is a broad comedy with a vein of satire and in the title role provides Mrs. Fiske with a character not only unique and new to the stage, but one totally dissimilar to any other which has ever enlisted the gifts of the leader of the American stage. There is nothing serious about Harry James Smith's comedy, and it seems almost like an artistic holiday for Mrs. Fiske, who plays the role with a zest and abandon that only a complete personal delight in it could dictate. She first appeared in the role of the social bouncer three years ago and has frequently done so since then but her coming engagement will mark her first presentation of the ludicrous farce in Clarksburg.


