

## BOARD APPOINTS FOUR PATROLMEN

For Four Counties to Protect Forests in Those Counties against Fire.

(SPECIAL TO THE TELEGRAM)  
ELKINS, W. Va., Sept. 21.—The executive committee of the Central West Virginia Fire Protective Association held a meeting in this city recently at which measures were adopted to cooperate with the state and federal government in preventing and controlling forest fires.

A majority of the board was present consisting of Merritt Wilson, George B. Thompson, Lloyd Hansford, George W. Wilson, secretary-treasurer, and W. H. Weber, field manager and forester of the association. J. A. Viquesney, forest, game and fish warden, and F. M. Glenn, special deputy were also present.

This association, which was organized several months ago for the purpose of supplementing the state and government in forest fire work, is composed of all the principal timber land owners in central and south-eastern West Virginia, the largest of whom are the Cherry River Boom & Lumber Company, with 210,000 acres, the Gauley Land Association with 175,000 acres, and The West Virginia Pulp & Paper Company with 150,000 acres. Other members are the Babcock Lumber Company; George Craig & Sons; Bonnis Lumber Company; Raine-Andrews Lumber Company; Wildell Lumber Company; Wilson Lumber Company; Gillfill, Neal & Company; Pocahontas Land & Development Company; Denmar Lumber Company; Gladly Fork Lumber Company; Porterwood Lumber Company, and the Williams' heirs.

All this land belonging to the association, comprising more than 800,000 acres is assessed annually at one cent per acre, which will be used in cooperation with the state and government in better protecting these forest lands from fire.

The state builds and equips lookout stations on high mountain peaks, the government furnishes lookout watchmen for these stations and the private owners, through this association, furnish patrolmen, which make a complete system as is now being used in the following seventeen states: Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, Kentucky, Michigan, Wisconsin, Idaho, Minnesota, Washington, Oregon and South Dakota.

At the Elkins meeting the following patrolmen were appointed and patrol routes assigned them:

W. F. Lipscomb, Parsons, Tucker county.  
T. A. Hall, Rupert, Greenbrier county.  
John Irvin, Richwood, Nicholas county.  
Lake Phillips, Spruce, Pocahontas county.

The forester, Mr. Weber, was given authority to employ four more patrolmen as soon as patrol routes could be assigned them. Sixteen federal lookout watchmen will be put on duty within the next few days and will remain on duty during the dry season.

A meeting of the board of directors will be held in this city on the sixteenth day of October for the purpose of taking further active steps in forestry work. The board of directors is composed of Merritt Wilson, W. T. Raine, H. W. Armstrong, E. V. Babcock, R. Chaffey, H. B. Curtin, Lloyd Hansford, J. W. McCullough, F. H. Anschutz, A. J. Armstrong, J. H. Dennison, George B. Thompson, John T. Davis, S. E. Slaymaker, and

J. H. Babb.  
The triple cooperation of state, government and private interests has been found to be the only successful method of combatting forest fires, and within a short time West Virginia will stand in the forefront of all states engaged in this important work.
