SERVICE COMMISSION PASSES THE SENATE

By a Strict Party Vote and Changed County Salary Bill is Presented.

(SPECIAL TO THE TELEGRAM)
CHARLESTON, Feb. 11.—By a strict party vote of 21 to 9, the public service commission bill as amended by the advocates of the bill passed the Senate Wednesday and goes to the House for concurrence. For the first time within a week the Republicans were united, even to the extent of cutting off debate except to explain votes. Rosenbloom, Republican, voted for the bill, but admitted he did not believe he was doing the right thing and that in two years he expected to vote against the measure. For Democrat, in explaining his vote, sought to attack the republican side but was cut off. The judiciary committee reported out the House county salary bill together with the Senate measure. It provides that no change shall be made during the present incumbents, which means four years for county and circuit clerks and two years for sheriffs. Increase in salary are also made in a majority of the counties.

Nine new bills were offered in the Senate bringing the total up to 323. Five of these were by Gregory and one a petition protesting against a production tax on oil and gas. All of them were of minor importance. Hatfield presented a request from the president of Monongalia Medical Society asking that the Miners' hospital at Fairmont be changed to a children's hospital. The county depositaries act on motion of Marshall was amended to become effective June 1, 1917 but was continued on its second reading until this afternoon.

In order that local measures may be disposed of the special committee on arranging the Senate calendar reported this morning that a night session would be held Thursday night for the purpose of taking up charters and local measures.

Six new bills were offered in the House, among them Delegate Porter's bill changing the time of opening and

Kansas Legislator Proposes to Prohibit Face Powder, Ear-rings and the Like.

TOPEKA, Kan., Feb. 11.—Kansas women under 45 years of age who wear ear rings or treat their faces with cosmetics "for the purpose of creating a false impression" will be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to fine if convicted, if a bill introduced in the lower house of the legislature Wednesday becomes a law. Face powder, perfume and false hair were among the articles enumerated in the list the women are forbidden. The bill provides that the women may not have their ears pierced or wear ear rings at parties or any public place.

GIRL JAILED

Mother Says Her Child, Who Threatened Her with Knife, is Incurable.

Hannah Shunk, seventeen-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Shunk, of the East End, was arrested and placed in the county jail Wednesday by Constable Robert McClung to await a hearing before Magistrate W. E. Starcher on a charge of incurability, preferred by her mother. The latter wants her committed to the state home for girls at Industrial, near Salem.

Mrs. Shunk declared, when making the complaint, that the daughter seized a big butcher knife and ran her out of the house a day or two ago, and that she is unable to control the child.

Will Be Begun by a Congressional Committee Friday at Parkersburg.

Representative McGillicuddy, of Maine, is the chairman of the sub-committee which also comprises Representative Gard, of Ohio, and Danforth, of New York.

PARKERSBURG, W. Va., Feb. 11.—The management of the ferry boat plying the Ohio river between this city and Belpro, O., has given notice that it will discontinue taking shipments of liquor from Belpro to this city in accordance with the orders from Fred O. Blue, state prohibition commissioner of West Virginia. To be on the safe side it was further decided to permit no passenger to carry liquor on their person when crossing the river to West Virginia.

OBsolete LAWS

Are to Be Stricken Out of the Codes of the State and Its Cities.

(BY ASSOCIATED PRESS)
HARRISBURG, Pa., Feb. 11.—The three codes prepared by the legislative reference bureau to bring the borough, tax and corporation laws up to the present needs were introduced in the House Wednesday, under the act of 1912. Representative McVicker, of Allegheny, presented the borough code; Representative Roney, Philadelphia, the taxation code, and Representative Stone, of Bradford, the corporation code. The codes contain all the existing laws and all obsolete measures have been stricken out. Speaker Ambler introduced the repealer doing away with the obsolete laws. The codes have been published throughout the state and hearings will be granted by committees. The resolution of Representative Rothberger, of Berks, to recommend that the appropriations committee defer trips of inspection was sent to the appropriations committee by an overwhelming vote. The House adjourned until February 15.

FOR GRAND JURY

Union Heights Coal Miner is Held Under Charge of Mistreating Daughter.

Joseph Correa, a coal miner of New Fair Grounds, who was recently jailed on the charge of forcibly having criminal relations with his thirteen-year-old daughter, Carmela, at her home, was held for the grand jury and remanded to jail Wednesday forenoon at the close of a hearing in Magistrate W. E. Starcher's court. Application for bail was made by attorneys for the defense, but this was taken under advisement by the magistrate. Correa's daughter went upon the stand at the hearing and related certain alleged advances made by her father, but the defendant did not testify. The testimony was given in Italian and translated to the court by an interpreter. The defendant was arrested at the instance of his brother, John.

FEW CANADIANS
