**TO CLOSE HOSPITAL.**  
WHEELING, May 22.—Declaring that he had spent \$500 a month from his private income during the last twenty years in order to maintain the Haskins hospital here, the doors of which had been opened to the public as widely as those of any public hospital in the state, Dr. Thomas M. Haskins has announced that he has done his share of work and will close the institution. It will be converted into a big apartment building in order to help to raise an old age fund for Dr. Haskins and his wife.

**LIFTED AT LAST**  
Is the Submarine Sunk Nearly Two Months Ago in the Harbor at Honolulu.  
WASHINGTON, May 22.—The submarine, F-7, lost in Honolulu harbor nineteen lives nearly two months ago, has at last been lifted clear of the ocean's bottom but naval officers have no assurance that the first sale will not part the cables again. Whether the cause of its loss can be determined after such a long period of submersion is doubtful.

LONDON, May 22.—One of the most remarkable features of the ministerial crisis in Great Britain at the present moment is the sudden outbreak, more or less severe of newspaper attacks upon Field Marshal Kitchener, the British secretary of war, who at the outbreak of the war was the nation's military idol and was loudly proclaimed by the same newspapers as the only man in the country for the position of war secretary.

**WOMAN PLEADS GUILTY AND GETS LONG TERM.**  
BUFFALO, May 22.—Mrs. Cynthia Bucum, the Little Valley woman, who has been on trial in the supreme court for two weeks on a charge of murdering her husband, Willis Bucum, by giving him repeated doses of poison, pleaded guilty to murder in the second degree Friday and was sentenced to twenty years in the penitentiary. The decision to plead guilty was reached by Mrs. Bucum and her lawyers after a conference that extended into the early hours of the morning.

**LABOR LEADER**  
Is Announced as Successor to Herbert Lewis Samuel on London Board.  
LONDON, May 22.—The first authoritative announcement as to an appointment in the British cabinet outside of Premier Asquith and Foreign Secretary Grey is that of Arthur Henderson, a labor leader, who succeeds Herbert Lewis Samuel as president of the local government board. The trade unionists are highly pleased at the appointment.

**ADJUDGED BANKRUPT.**  
PARKERSBURG, May 22.—On petition of local merchandising firms, United States District Judge A. G. Dayton has adjudged J. C. McGregor, an Ellenboro merchant, a bankrupt. The case has been referred to a referee and the first meeting of creditors set for June 2.

**CRUSHED TO DEATH.**  
KINGWOOD, May 22.—Birch Felton, 53, was instantly killed when his head was caught and crushed between a revolving pulley and belt at Jason Elyard's saw mill near here. He was getting out lumber for the erection of a large silo on his farm.

**WARRANTS ARE DISMISSED.**  
On motion of the state, the warrants against Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Reed, of the Broadwater flats, Glen Elk, charging them with violating the prohibition law, were dismissed late Thursday in Magistrate W. E. Starcher's court. When arrested recently in their apartments a suit case of whiskey was seized.

Mrs. Ella Hall, of College Hill, took the tourists' excursion for Baltimore Thursday night, where she will remain for a few days and take treatment for an eye trouble.  
A game of baseball between the Pennsboro high school team and Salem, was scheduled to be played Thursday, but was postponed on account of rain. It was played Friday afternoon—result: Pennsboro 9, Salem 2.  
The Hon. Walter Mills will speak in Salem Saturday evening on some phases of Socialism. He is reputed to be a famous and magnetic speaker.  
Two Belgium refugees, Mr. and Mrs. Andre Hiermoux, have arrived here. They lost their personal possessions in the beginning of the war and managed to reach New York City where they telegraphed friends here of their needs and the local Belgium Relief Committee forwarded the necessary funds to pay their railroad fare to Salem.  
Money was also sent in response to a telegram purporting to be from Helen Kruseberg, a sister of Leon Kruseberg, of this city, who was known to be in Belgium at the time of the invasion by the Germans. However, the girl has not arrived and the affair seems shrouded in deep mystery, as the Ellis Island immigration authorities state no Helen Kruseberg has arrived from Europe. Interested relatives have taken the matter up with the department of state.

WASHINGTON, May 22.—Proposed increased bituminous coal carload rates from Clearfield, Pa., district to Oneville and Providence, R. I., over the Pennsylvania railroad were suspended Friday by the Interstate Commerce Commission for investigation until September 21.
