## STORM

Causes Death of Six Persons and Injury to at Least Sixty More in Southwest.

FORT SMITH, Ark., May 28.—Six persons are reported dead, two at Tahleah, Okla., and four at Cecotah, Okla., as a result of the storm which swept western Arkansas and eastern Oklahoma Wednesday and Thursday. Reports reaching here from Antlers, Okla., also assert that more than sixty persons were injured at Tahleah. Wire and rail communication in the stricken district is almost impossible and some estimates place the loss of life at a large figure. Property damage is heavy and it is said will reach more than a million dollars. Fears of serious floods also are increasing.

## TORPEDOED

Is a Steamer of Montreal as Well as Shelled by a German Submarine.

## ITALIAN ARMY IN READINESS TO STRIKE AUSTRIA HEAVY BLOW

The entrance of Italy into the war throws close to 2,000,000 thoroughly trained and splendidly equipped soldiers into the scale on the side of the allies. The months that have intervened between the outbreak of the war and Italy's intervention have been utilized in learning all the lessons to be taught by the campaigns on both fronts and in preparing both army and navy "to the last button."

Italy has had an army of at least 1,000,000 men massed along the Austrian frontier, facing a probably numerically inferior force of Germans and Austrians who, however, hold the upper ground and are undoubtedly strongly fortified. Military experts agree, however, that there is at least a strong probability that no serious attempt will be made to invade Austria by frontal attack.

## CALM CONFIDENCE

Follows Stormy Clamor in the City of Rome for Entrance into the War.

ROME, via Paris, May 28.—Except for the hags, which fly not only from every house but almost from every window, Rome gives little indication of being the capital of a country which has entered upon a great war. While the entire nation was eager for the conflict a spirit of calm confidence has followed the stormy scenes which were enacted from the time the Salandra cabinet resigned until it was restored to power and the demonstrations of rejoicing which followed until the opening of hostilities. It is apparent that the nation is preparing to make, without complaint, whatever sacrifice the war may bring.

## BANK LOSES

In the United States Circuit Court of Appeals as the Case Went Up Wrong.

RICEMOND, Va., May 28.—Petition of the Home Bank for Savings, of Clarksburg, asking the United States Circuit court of appeals to superintend and revise the proceedings of the district court there in bankruptcy case has been dismissed by the higher tribunal, which held that the matter came up in the shape of an appeal. The bank asserted that it had preferred a claim of \$3,500 against the estate of Wilhelmina Wittigshlager, based on an attachment sued out prior to the time this party was adjudicated a bankrupt, but the district court refused to recognize the priority of the claim on the ground that the attachment proceedings took place within four months of the date of adjudication of bankruptcy.

It is understood that it is now too late for appeal to be made.

## CHINESE SUFFER

Enormously in Treaty Matters and They Are Ashamed and Humiliated.

PEKING, China, May 28.—The text of the two treaties and three notes signed on Tuesday by Japan and China was published here Thursday. President Yuan Shi-Kai issued a proclamation in reference to the treaties in which he said:

"Our rights and privileges in Manchuria have suffered enormously. We are ashamed and humiliated by our weakness and insult. Let all the people unite and work harmoniously for the supreme object of saving the country."
