GREENE MONUMENT IS DULY UNVEILED AT BATTLE GROUND

Where Cornwallis, British General, Lost So Heavily That He Had to Retreat.

BATTLE GROUND, N. C. July 3.—One hundred and thirty years after he led his command to victory over General Cornwallis's red-coats at Guilford court house.

Unveiled today on this famous battlefield in honor of the memory of General Nathaniel Greene, who commanded the Colonial forces in the South, during the latter part of the American revolution. It was in this vicinity that the battle was fought on March 15, 1781, which resulted in such heavy losses to Cornwallis, the British, that he was forced to retreat to Wilmington, N. C.

Troops from the colonies of Rhode Island, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina took part in the battle and today's exercises provided for the participation of representatives of these states, including several governors. Both state and federal troops participated, among them the Kentish Guards, of

COLONEL HARDING MAY BE GOVERNOR

Of the Panama Canal Following the Retirement of Colonel George Goethals.

PANAMA, July 3.—During the latter part of August and the early days of September, next, several important changes will take place among the higher personnel of the Panama canal. The resignation of Major General George W. Goethals, U. S. A., as governor of the Panama canal and his departure from the isthmus, where he has been in supreme command for the last eight years, will be the beginning of other changes.

The most important of these will be the probable elevation of Lieutenant Colonel Chester Harding, U. S. A., from head of the department of maintenance and operation, to his present position as governor of the Panama canal. This understanding has not been contradicted by General Goethals, and it is believed that Colonel Harding would succeed to the governorship. In fact General Goethals has let it be known that he obtained the details of Colonel Harding to the isthmus for that very purpose.


Immediately after his resignation as governor and his departure from Panama, General Goethals plans to apply for his retirement from active service with the army. His intention is to take a year's vacation and then to engage in private engineering consultation work, New York City. In this venture he probably will be joined by his son, Captain George R. Goethals, U. S. A., and Sidney B. Williamson, long a civilian engineer on the canal work.

Before General Goethals's departure the detail of Captain Hugh Rodman, U. S. N., from shore duty as marine superintendent with the Panama canal to the command of the New York will have been announced by the navy department. Early this year Captain Rodman applied to the department for a return to sea duty on the departure of General Goethals from Panama. His request was granted and he was assured of the command of the New York. He probably will be succeeded by Commander Hutch I. Cone, U. S. N., now commanding the Dixie.


