OIL AND GAS

Interest in the Evans City pool, in Butler county, has somewhat subsided since all of the late completions have come in light. Another has been added to the list of light producers. It is in Hay and Company's well on the Leonard lot, located a few feet south-east of the small producer on the Garvin lot. The well on the small Irwin lot is so light that the owners are undetermined as to whether it would be worth giving it a shot.

In the face of the size of the late wells completed at Evans City some of the town lot operators are revising their estimates as to how much a town lot well will be worth at the end of thirty days. The handwriting on the wall indicates that there will be quite a shrinkage. It will require a much longer time to get back the money invested than it took to put in a town lot well. It is more a question of what part, if any, these town lot ventures will pay back.

Several Flows.  
McSweeney and Company's well on the Pierce lot, one of the most important as to location, is drilling in the sand and has made several light flows. The McSweeney lot well is located the farthest down the creek and the farthest to the west of any well in the development. The fact that it is showing for a better producer than the wells to the east is something of a surprise. Had the well failed to produce it would have been no great surprise. Another important well on the west side is the one drilling on the Wick lot. They undertook to drill the well through the 100-foot sand "wet" and stuck the tools, and have been fishing for some days. It will likely be necessary to move the rig. This location is farther to the west than the Pierce lot well, and if it comes in a producer will extend the producing limits of the pool in that direction.

The Wildwood Oil Company's well on the Sutton lot is due to get the sand today. This location is inside of defined limits. In the central part of the development there are six or more wells due to get the sand within a week. The South Penn Oil Company's No. 5 on the White farm con-

tinues to decline. For the twenty-four hours ending at 7 o'clock yesterday morning it produced about 350 barrels. During a part of the day it was agitated and drilled a little deeper, but deeper drilling did not increase its production.

West Virginia.  
The West Virginia fields are completing very few wells, and nearly all are light producers. There is more interest centered in the wildcats drilling in Kanawha county than in any other district. In the old Blue Creek field in Elk district, Kanawha county, Grossup, Rummel, Schwabe and Company have drilled their No. 2 on the David J. Jarrett eighty-five acres from the Squaw to the Weir sand and have a five-barrel pumper. For many months drilling down old wells in the Blue Creek field has been quite a feature. In almost every instance production in small quantities has been found in the lower formation.

Southwestern Ohio.  
Light wells and dusters are the best the Southeastern Ohio fields are supplying at this time. In Wayne township, Belmont county, the National Gas Company of West Virginia, has drilled a test on the Addison Moore farm, through the Berea grit and has a duster. In Jefferson township, Noble county, E. W. Cline has drilled No. 16 on the Coal lands, through the Berea grit, and has a light pumper in that formation.

In the Junction City district, in the deep sand territory in Jackson township, Perry county, the Carter Oil Company's No. 6 on the H. C. Baughman farm is producing 80 barrels a day and Ralph Brothers' No. 2 on the T. E. Newman farm, sixty barrels a day. In Grandview township, Washington county, C. F. Casper and Company are drilling No. 7 on the McMahon heirs' farm.




Probably a New Pool.  
In the Dorseyville district, Indian township, Allegheny county, the prospects for a new thirty-foot pool are very promising. About ten days ago Walley and Company drilled in a well on the Jeanette McCorkle farm and the well produced 1,200 barrels the first week after it was completed. Two miles, nearly due south of this well, the National Oil Company has completed a test on the James Pollock farm and has a ten-barrel pumper in the same formation. There is quite a scope of territory in that section that had not been previously tested, and there is a good deal of new work starting. The indications are that the next oil excitement in Allegheny county will be located in Indian township. North of and adjoining the Jeanette McCorkle farm, the American Natural Gas Company has the rig completed for a test on the Mary A. Haas farm. Northeast of the McCorkle farm, the National Oil Com-

pany is building the rig for a test on the W. J. Robinson farm. Walley and Company have made the location for a second test on the Jeanette McCorkle farm. The same parties are down 500 feet at No. 7 on the Mrs. Cochran farm.

This development lines up with other thirty-foot pools in Allegheny county, starting with the one at Imperial and extending northeast through Moon, Stowe, Reserve, Allegheny and Shaler township.
