Apple Ring Salad.
Pare and core two apples and cut them in rings; brush the slices with lemon juice and dip each slice in French dressing; arrange the rings on lettuce leaves or watercress and put between them layers of chopped English walnuts and celery; lay a ball of cream cheese on top and serve with mayonnaise.

Apple Meringue.
Peel and core tart apples and boil; put through a colander and then sweeten the mash. To one pint of this pulp stir up lightly the whipped whites of three eggs flavored with lemon. Set the dish in the stove, brown lightly and serve cold with cream.

Persons paying all their taxes will receive a discount of two and one-half per cent from November 1 to November 30, 1915. All tax books will be at the sheriff's office, where you will be allowed the usual discount of two and one-half per cent. Go early in the month, for the last days of November are busy ones. In this office, after January 1, 1916, ten per cent interest must be added. No partial payments on taxes can be accepted.

When calling or writing for amount of taxes, describe the property, state its exact location. He has twenty-seven tax books. Be sure your receipts cover all your property.
