MR. DARST PROMISES NOT TO RUN ANY MORE FOR A PUBLIC OFFICE

When He Makes His First Speech in the Campaign, if Elected Governor.

WINFIELD, Nov. 15.—State Auditor John S. Darst, Republican candidate for the governorship, made his first speech of the campaign to a large crowd of Putnam county voters here Monday.

In his maiden speech of the campaign, Auditor Darst frankly declared he was seeking the Republican gubernatorial nomination and promised his hearers that if he were elected to the office he would not be a candidate for any other public office, but would retire to private life.

"I make this statement," the auditor concluded, "because I feel I would make a better governor by removing the temptation of aspiring to higher honors."

Auditor Darst declared he was opposed to the passage of unnecessary new legislation, asserted that it would be wise to get better acquainted with our present statutes, announced his opposition to the creation of useless new departments, and recited he would oppose any unnecessary legislation increasing taxation while confronted with the gigantic Virginia debt judgment.

"Should I be nominated and elected governor, I will give to the people a strictly business administration, and be just and fair to every interest, big and little. I will conduct the state's business as I would my own, or the business of a corporation were I employed by them. I feel that my experience in public life will be worth something to the people, if I am entrusted with the honor and responsibility of the governorship."

"I do not feel we need many new laws, especially at this time. I think it would be wise for the present to get better acquainted with the laws we have, and eliminate the bad

and preserve the good. My observation has been that some of the states have passed laws in the last few years, under the head of so-called progressive legislation, that have proved in many cases very disappointing to the citizens of those states when practically tested out, resulting in very largely increased taxation, and little or no additional service rendered to the people.

"Especially am I opposed at this time to any legislation which creates new departments and involves additional drains upon the state's finances by adding more men to the pay roll. If I should be elected governor, I certainly would stand for retraction along this line; I would combine the employees of the state to the least possible number, consistent with good service. I would endeavor to see to it that the state gets 100 cents value for every dollar expended of the funds under my control."

"If there has been a time in the history of the state when good business methods should be put in practice, it is at this time. With a judgment of over \$11,000,000 hanging over this state, and with the many growing needs of the people, for public improvement and otherwise, it will take careful management to conduct the business of the state in a way that will meet the demands of the people for public improvements, and at the same time, not burden them or prevent outside enterprises from coming in, because of the excessive tax rate."

"If I am elected governor, I will have no higher ambition when my term of office is over, and I will retire to private life well satisfied with the opportunity given me by the people to try to render service to them. I make this statement because I feel I would make a better governor by removing the temptation of aspiring to higher honors."

TICKET SELLING IS QUITE AN ART

With Courtesy the Most Important Factor, Declares George W. Squiggins.

Pertinent facts relating to the training of a salesman of passenger transportation on a railroad are given in an interesting and direct way by George W. Squiggins, general passenger agent of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad, who is widely known among passenger traffic men throughout the country. Mr. Squiggins makes it plain that a man must be as well equipped to sell transportation as the salesman

who represents a mercantile house. The Baltimore and Ohio official mentions courtesy as an essential quality in the makeup of a successful transportation salesman.

"Courtesy is most important factor," says Mr. Squiggins. "The traveling man is entitled to fair treatment. Railroad management has promised this, but it rests with the ticket seller and conductor (who is just as much a salesman as the ticket seller), whether the passenger receives what he pays for."

"Ticket salesmanship is no profession for the grouchy man or one who is indifferent to the interests of the company that employs him. If he considers the duties favorably, he should then fit himself for the position. The elementary training should be carefully administered, and should embrace the necessary necessities of person for a well regulated office, and for tariffs and other paraphernalia to be in their proper places. The student would then have the material equipment for a course in scientific salesmanship. This would mean study pertaining to travel, a thorough knowledge of the railroad on which he is employed, the advantages it has over other lines, such as its beautiful scenery, rivers, valleys, so pleasing to the eye; its historical interest, etc."

"The expert salesman also has a thorough understanding with the customer before delivering the goods, explaining in detail the contract of the ticket, when it is to be used, and is particularly careful in pointing out its conditions and provisions, such as destination, limit, etc. Some merchants guarantee, barring unforeseen accidents, the goods they sell. None but competent salesman, however, can do this. The results from such reliability are wonderful."

"Science in selling transportation requires prompt attention. You must be able to readily understand the inquiry of your customer. Co-operation from assistants—teamwork, as it were—produces more expert ticket salesman than aspiring for individual records. No man can be a salesman to be commended because he resorts to complicity and spends his money with his customers."

"The books of trains—the timetable—is the catalog used by the railroad in pointing out to its patrons the transportation facilities they offer, and it is naturally one of the most important exhibits entering into a selling operation. It should be such that the expert salesman can explain the contents in a manner that will appeal to the traveler."
