

MONTENEGRO MIDGET FOE OF THE TURKS

And Its People Are Said to Have Been Born of Some Fierce Struggles.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11.—"Montenegro," upon whose conquest and subjugation, the Austrians are said to have determined, is distinguished in history as the constant, irrepressible, fanatic midget foe of the Turkish empire," begins a statement last issued by the National Geographic Society, which reviews the tumultuous history of the Black mountain people, who today, defying greater powers than the Turk, are facing the menace of a national extinction and oblivion. The primer continues:

"The Montenegrins, as a people, were born of the fierce struggles that preceded Turkish mastery of the Balkans. In the middle ages, Montenegro belonged to the Serbian kingdom. Over the battlefield of Kossovo (1289), the Serbian state was swept away. The prince-ruler of Montenegro, of royal Serbian blood, gathered his mountaineers about him, together with the remnants of the folk who fled from the plains, and began the centuries-long, deadly drama of the Turkish-Montenegrin feud, one of the longest, most bitter and relentless feuds of history.

Invasion in Vain.
"Wave after wave of Ottoman invasion dashed its force in vain against the inaccessible Black mountain country, and, between the times of Turkish efforts at conquest, upon the least or no provocation at all, the Montenegrins sought the Turk in his own country, carrying death and destruction to the plains. By 1845, the Montenegrins found themselves shut fast within their mountains. Their last secular prince gave up his office in 1516, leaving the country under the leadership of his bishop.

"The Porte continued to claim the land, and, after generations of loss and endeavor, conquered it temporarily in 1714. The Turks had no sooner clambered down the mountain sides, than the Montenegrins reasserted their independence. They obtained the support of Russia, the conditions being an annual subsidy from the Tsar and

Continual harassment of the Turks by the Montenegrins. Both sides have kept their agreement with steady faith ever since; for the Tsar has never been found wanting in his financial help and the Montenegrins have never when they could with decency get into a war with Tur-

troubles in 1877, and were the first to declare war in 1912.

"In 1851, the last prince-bishop died; for his successor, Danilo I., dropped his religious functions and appeared as a secular prince. Since then the tiny state, dedicated to war, has

Climbed and Climbed. Its ambitions mostly overlooked or smiled at by the powers, until today it is a full-fledged kingdom with a daughter of its royal family upon the Italian throne. The independent of Montenegro was recognized by the great nations at the Berlin conference in 1878. A close personal and political friendship existed between the imperial house of Russia and the reigning house of Montenegro, and this friendship, probably, is one of the strongest anchors to the windward that the little kingdom has in its present day of peril."
