West Virginia Briefs

PARKERSBURG: Honoring Judge W. N. Miller, of this city, member of the West Virginia supreme court of appeals, the Wood County Bar Association Friday evening will give a dinner in the Chancellor hotel. Details of the program are being worked out by the committee in charge, of which Attorney B. M. Ambler is chairman.

CHARLESTON: The public service commission is considering an application of the Coal and Coke Railroad Company to discontinue some of its stock and of the City Taxicab Company, of Charleston, to increase its rates. No action is expected for some time. Expert accountants have arrived to give testimony in the hearing of the petition of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad Company to increase passenger rates.

WHEELING: Harold Wells, 16 years old and Lydia Wells, 9 years old, children of Mrs. Emma Wells, of Friendly, thirty-five miles south of here, died from burns caused when one child started to shake ashes out of the stove and a hot cinder fell in an oil can. An explosion resulted.

HUNTINGTON: The United States government faces another crisis. Half a thousand disciples of Isaac Walton who for years have fished from a wall of the United States government dam 28, in the Ohio river, are preparing an ultimatum to the government, following the posting of a notice by United States engineers that the practice must cease. This destroys the favorite fishing resort of men and women anglers of this section. The orders were issued because of the fear that some of the fishermen might fall from the wall and drown, making the government liable for damages.

CHESTER: Reports indicate that the West Virginia crop of apples this year will be a bumper one, but that the peach crop will be short on account of the freeze. Last year the peach crop was so heavy that it resulted in sending the prices down so low that in many orchards they were allowed to rot on the ground, orchardists declaring the prices did not justify picking them.

BECKLEY: The county court of Raleigh county has purchased a \$2,000 automobile truck to be used in conveying county prisoners to and from their work on the roads.

WHEELING: In a letter to a local newspaper a man who signs his name "Charles," announces that he has a diamond stud, valued at \$2,000 stolen from Frank G. Beck during a wrestling match between Dr. Ben Roller and "Strangler" Lewis, here, a year ago. The man asks if the reward of \$250, offered by Beck for the return of the diamond, still holds good. "Charles" says he attended the wrestling match and got the stud while it was being passed in the crowd. He said it scratched his hand and he grabbed it. Since then, he said, he had kept it, fearing to return it for fear he would be arrested and charged with its theft.
