BLOOD POISON

Causes Death of Thomas Dolan Well Known School Boy of Weston.

Thomas Dolan, aged 14 years, a well known and popular school boy of Weston, died at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon in a local hospital, just two hours after he reached the hospital, from blood poison caused by an injury he received a week ago when he engaged his foot on a sharp board.

At the time of the accident it was not thought to be serious, but later infection set in and he was brought to the hospital here Sunday noon. An X-ray picture of the injury was taken, and it was soon that the foot was badly infected with blood poison, but before anything could be done for him he passed away.

The deceased boy is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John A. Dolan, of Weston.

The body was prepared for burial and taken to his home Sunday evening. The funeral services will be held in St. Patrick's Catholic church at Weston and the burial will be in a Weston cemetery. The hour and date of the funeral will be announced later.

TRACTION SERVICE

Crippled on the Weston Interurban Line Sunday by the Heavy Storm.

High tension wire trouble at Broadford bridge, Milford road and Spring Hill on the Weston line of the Monongahela Valley Traction Company caused by the heavy storm Sunday afternoon, crippled traffic on that line from 3 o'clock in the afternoon until 9 o'clock Sunday night.

The Despart car line was also out of commission for an hour and half Sunday evening on account of the track being blocked with cinders which washed down on the line from the Baltimore and Ohio tracks near the double crossing.

The Fairmont interurban line and the city lines encountered no trouble, although three cars on the city lines were burned out by lightning and had to be replaced. This caused only slightly delays.


SENT TO THE ROADS.




