WAR IS LIKELY TO BE DECLARED ON TOMORROW

WILSON IS NOT TO WAIT ANY LONGER

For a Definite Reply from Carranza to Note Demanding Men's Release. WAR DEPARTMENT IS BUSY Every Day's Delay in Evident Break Sees Our Troops in Better Position.

EL PASO, June 27.—Two negro troopers, ragged and half dead from hardships are lodged in jail at Juarez today, having been brought from Guzman, where they were captured by defunct government troops.

WASHINGTON, June 27.—There were clear indications today that if American cavalrymen captured by Mexican troops at Carrizal were not released within forty hours action would be taken by the United States.

While the diplomatic aspects of the crisis awaiting action, the war department drove forward its efforts to hasten mobilization of the national guard on the border. It is certain that no aggressive military operation can be undertaken until a substantial number of state troops is available to back up the regulars who unquestionably would lead any movement.

Mexican officials here have expressed the opinion that General Carranza would surrender the American prisoners, whatever the reply he might make to the demand for a formal statement of his purposes.

TRAINS READY AT MT. GRETTA To Carry the First Brigade of Pennsylvania Troops to Mexican Border.

MT. GRETTA, Pa., June 27.—Thirteen trains were on the railroad siding here early today ready to carry the First brigade and auxiliary organizations the first of Pennsylvania's national guard to answer the call for border service, southward, five days' rations and 200 rounds of ammunition were issued for each of the 3,200 men comprising the brigade last night and the movement towards Mexico was expected to begin today.
