





Varsity Coaches See Fine Outlook

Tobin and McIntyre Here Today, and Report Bright Prospect for Ste Eleven.

Elgie Tobin and "Monty" McIntyre, coaches of the West Virginia football team for the present season, were in Clarksburg today, on their return from a jaunt over the southern part of the state in the interest of athletics generally for the university and especially in the interest of the football team.

The canvass of the state, which is just about closed, by these coaches brings to light the fact that of all the football material of West Virginia, which will enroll in various colleges this fall, in the state and out of the state, at least eighty per cent of the football material will enroll at West Virginia University.

Football prospects at the little city down the river are most encouraging and the outlook is a great one. That West Virginia is going ahead and even better than the championship team of last fall, is the opinion of many who are in close touch with the situation.

Of the 'varsity squad of thirty players for last season, only five will be lost, and only one of these five was a regular the past season. And at that there is still a possibility of this regular coming back for another year of study and football.

The 'varsity will open September 30 with the University of Pennsylvania, on Franklin field, Philadelphia. U. of P. has a new coach in Bob Fowell, the man who put Washington and Jefferson on the football map. Reports come from Philadelphia that Fowell will have a most promising squad to pick from--that his squad will number at least 200 players. The call is out for these men to report on September 10, and this fact alone shows that the old Washington and Jefferson coach knows West Virginia's strength and does not intend to be caught napping and with a defeat for the first game of the season.

On the other hand Coaches McIntyre and Tobin are just as determined that Penn will start the season with a defeat as Penn is that West Virginia will fall short on Franklin field. West Virginia has never defeated the University of Pennsylvania, but this year a special effort will be made to start what looks like a successful season with a victory. Penn was victorious by one touchdown last year over West Virginia.

Present reports indicate that on this year's squad the names of several Clarksburg boys will appear. These boys are sure to be heard from before the season is over. Coaches McIntyre and Tobin expressed their regret that the 'varsity did not play in this city this fall, both of these men wanted to play here, especially for the large alumni situated here and which is one of the liveliest, wide-awake crowds of old "grads" of any city in the state.
