WORKERS MUST QUIT OR BE TREATED AS TRAITORS

Leaders of the Movement Refrain from Calling It a Sympathetic Strike.

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—Trade unions in this city and Westchester county Saturday began to vote on the question of ratifying the action of eighty delegates who Friday called for a "general suspension of work" next Wednesday morning. The labor chiefs appealed to all union wage earners to stay at home until the traction companies make it possible for them to ride in the street cars without offense to their union allegiance.


