OIL AND GAS DEVELOPMENT OF TRI-STATE

Latest Reports of Operations in West Virginia, Pennsylvania and Ohio.

The Thirty-foot development on Dent's run, Mannington district, Marion county, W. Va., is furnishing the best producers in the eastern fields. Huffman and Hickman's No. 3 on the Alfred Kendall farm is holding up very creditably. For the nineteen hours ending at 7 o'clock yesterday morning the gauge showed a production of 582 barrels. For the twenty-four hours ending at the same time the Z. E. Bateson No. 1 produced 275 barrels. On the same stream and in the same district, the South Penn Oil Company drilled No. 3 on the J. L. Rex farm, eight feet into the Thirty-foot sand and the hole filled up 1,000 feet with fluid. They are still drilling in the sand.

On Coon's run, McClelland district, Doddridge county, B. C. McIntyre and Company drilled a second test on the J. O. and G. C. Shrader farm through the Big Injun sand and it shows for a twenty-five or thirty-barrel producer. The location is 600 feet north of No. 1 on the same farm.

In the Weir Sand territory on Blue creek, Elk district, Kanawha county, the Ohio Fuel Company completed No. 3 on the Monteville VanCamp farm and it produced forty barrels the first twenty-four hours. The location is 1,000 feet southeast of No. 1 on the Mary F. Myers farm. On Indian creek in the same district, the same company completed and shot No. 8 on the Elk River Coal Company's property and it shows for a light pumper.

On the same stream and in the same district the South Penn Oil Company has the rigs completed for No. 4 on the J. A. Boggs farm and No. 7 on the R. J. Morris farm. On White Oak creek, Washington district, Calhoun county, the Hope Natural Gas Company drilled a test on the C. A. Jarvis farm through the Big Injun sand and found no oil but a fair gas pressure. The location is one mile west of the same company's test on the M. J. Duffield farm.

Calhoun county has considerable test work under way and starting. The Hope Natural Gas Company is due in the sand at a test on the G. Rice farm and is drilling at 1,700 feet at a second test on the same farm. G. L. Cabot is down 1,000 feet at a test on the Rebecca and Charles Arthur farm.

On McCowan creek, Walton district, Boone county, the Republic Oil and Gas Company's No. 16 on the Nancy C. Hively farm is a ten-barrel pumper in the Big Injun sand. The same company has the rig completed for No. 9 on the W. H. Plesher farm.

In Walker district, Wood county, W. H. Jones has drilled No. 22 on the Wood county tract through the Salt sand and it is a very light pumper. V. S. Palmer has started to drill a test on the A. Tennant farm and Flint and Strothers have the rig completed for a test on the Susan Amos farm. G. I. Bunnell is due in the sand at a test on the S. Cooley farm.

Southeastern Ohio. Completions in the deep sand territory in southeastern Ohio are not of a size to inspire active development work. Occasionally a good producer is found but the average size of the majority is small. In the old Gore field in Falls Gore township,
