West Virginia Briefs

MARTINSBURG: Because there has been a delay in the payment of life insurance, which is necessary to pay funeral expenses, the body of "Aunt" Susan Sandridge, an aged colored woman, lies unburied, although she died seven weeks ago. The body was carefully embalmed.

CHARLESTON: The secretary of state has issued a charter of incorporation to the Raven Carbon Company of Rosedale, chief works in Braxton county; authorized capital \$200,000; incorporators, A. L. Freeman, John B. King, James E. Sterritt, William A. Smith, all of New York, and J. Mills Hoff, of Oakland, Calif.

PARKERSBURG: For injuries alleged to have been received when she tripped upon a loose board in a walk, Mrs. Sophronia Meeks has entered suit against the city of Parkersburg for \$10,000 damages.

KENOVA: Mrs. Lula Chapman, past state councilor, has completed the organization of Rainbow council, Daughters of America, at Milton.

CHARLES TOWN: Good prices for farm lands in this section continue. Bell Brothers, of Clarke county, Va., have purchased the Charles H. Lewis farm near Myerstown for \$13,500. T. T. Perry has bought the Falman farm near Shepherdstown for \$16,000. John P. Rissler has taken over the Warhaven farm from C. P. Wall for \$5,200. J. Stricker Moler has purchased the Melvin farm near Villa from Buckles Brothers for \$15,300. Prices range from \$55 to \$100 an acre.

PARKERSBURG: James L. Wells, traveling salesman for a snuff company, is in the City hospital with serious injuries received when an automobile he was driving went over a thirty foot embankment near here.

CHARLESTON: Application has been made to the public service commission by the People's United Telephone Company for permission to advance rates charged to subscribers. The company operates in Harrison, Lewis, Taylor, Barbour, Wetzel, Upshur, Braxton, Glimer, Doddridge and Tyler counties.

MORGANTOWN: Frank Deavers, a motor brakeman, was decapitated while at work in the Elkins and Cowe coal mine at Masontown. A train of coal cars ran over him. He was twenty years old and leaves a widow and two children.

CHARLESTON: A military funeral was conducted in Charleston for Private Raymond C. O'Quinn, clerk of Company K, Second West Virginia Infantry, who died as a result of a self-inflicted wound. The services were held in St. John's Episcopal church.

PARKERSBURG: The body of John Roller, a Bell telephone inspector, of Philadelphia, was found in the Ohio river here.

CHARLESTON: The annual conference of the African Methodist Episcopal church for West Virginia is in session here. The opening ceremony was delivered by the Rev. C. R. Ranson, of New York. The Rev. C. T. Shafer, of Chicago, will preach tonight.

WHEELING: Officers were elected at the annual convention of the Churches of Christ of the Wheeling district here as follows: The Rev. F. B. Imhof, Rollinsbee, president; the Rev. Harry Ruberson, of Elm Grove, vice president; the Rev. F. M. Biddle, Warwood, secretary-treasurer.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA.
A Proclamation: By the Governor, I, Henry D. Hatfield, Governor of the State of West Virginia, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of said State, announcing to the voters of the State of West Virginia that, on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, in the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, there will be held a general election on that day, there will be submitted for ratification or rejection an amendment to the Constitution of said State as follows: to-wit:

Proposed Amendment.
That Section one of Article four of said Constitution as it is now is to be altered and amended so as to read as follows: "Section one. To citizens of the State, male and female, shall be entitled to vote at all elections held within the county in which they respectively reside; but no person who is a minor or of unsound mind, or a pauper, or who is under conviction of treason or bribery in an election, or who has not been a resident of the State for one year, and of the county in which he or she offers to vote, for sixty days next preceding such offer, shall be permitted to vote while such disability continues; but no person in the military, naval or marine service of the United States shall be deemed a resident of this State by reason of being stationed therein."

The proposed amendment is designated as "Woman's Suffrage Amendment" and on the official ballot to be voted at said election will be printed the following: **BALLOT ON CONSTITUTIONAL WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT.**
Amending Section one of Article Four.
For ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment.
Against ratification of Woman's suffrage Amendment.

Those favoring the ratification of said Amendment will vote "For Ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment" and those opposing will vote "Against Ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment." Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State, at the Capitol, this eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, and of the State the Fifty-fourth.
