CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA.
A Proclamation of the Governor, I, Henry D. Hatfield, Governor of the State of West Virginia, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of said State, announcing to the voters of the State of West Virginia that, on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, in the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, at the general election held on that day, there will be submitted for ratification and approval to the voters of the State of West Virginia, as follows: to-wit:

Proposed Amendment.
That Section one of Article four of said Constitution as it is now is to be altered and amended so as to read as follows:
"Section one of Article four of the Constitution of the State of West Virginia, in which both male and female shall be entitled to vote at all elections held within the limits in which they respectively reside; but no person who is a minor or of unsound mind, or a pauper, or who is under conviction of treason, or bribery in an election of the State for one year, or in the year in which he or she offers to vote, for sixty days next preceding such offer, shall be permitted to vote while such disability continues; but no person in the military, naval or marine service of the United States shall be deemed a resident of this State by reason of being stationed there-in."

The proposed amendment is designated as "Woman Suffrage Amendment" on the official ballot to be voted at said election will be printed the following:
WOMAN SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT.
Amending Section one of Article Four.
For ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment.
Against ratification of Woman's Suffrage Amendment.
Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State, at the Capitol, this eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, and of the State the Fifty-fourth.
