WILSON POLICY LEADS TO WAR, WILLCOX SAYS

Foreign Nations Will Intervene unless Mexican Trouble is Settled.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 16.—William R. Willcox, chairman of the Republican national committee, discussing the popular slogan of the Democratic party in this campaign, "He (Wilson) has kept us out of war," makes the assertion that any man who may have been favorably disposed toward the president by this contention will, if he but thinks for himself, soon become convinced that Mr. Wilson is "following a course which must inevitably lead this nation into war." Chairman Willcox asserts that Mr. Wilson's course in Mexico will make war not only with that country, but with European nations, unescapable because it is evident to intelligent men that present conditions in Mexico cannot endure.

"Throughout that half-settled but once prosperous country absolute anarchy exists, the rights of no man are respected, night alone prevails, and while Carranza with the aid of the United States is now in control in Mexico City his authority is constantly disputed and defied," Mr. Willcox points out. He calls attention to the fact that Villa, on whose head President Wilson set a price, still lives and constitutes a menace to Carranza, as he will to anyone else who becomes head of the de facto government.

Chairman Willcox declares that Mexico has been developed almost entirely by foreign capital and, hardly a week passes, he says, but the ambassadors of some foreign powers knock at the doors of the White House, demanding for their citizens in Mexico a protection which Carranza is unable to give them if he would, a reimbursement for losses which Carranza is unable to give them. Along this line Chairman Willcox continues:

What, then, is to be the outcome of this situation? What has been the outcome of similar conditions in the Philippines and Cuba, in Haiti and Santo Domingo? The people of these countries have been unable to establish order themselves and in each it has been necessary for the United States, by force of arms, to restore order and establish a government which could maintain it.

When certain situations arise no President can prevent war—and the Mexican policy of this administration is precipitating just such a situation.

Responsible for Anarchy. Everyone but President Wilson's apologists and supporters hold Mr. Wilson responsible for the anarchy which exists in Mexico today; believe that his personal attack on Huerta—who had it to his credit that he had

never injured Americans or other foreigners, was as terrible, as it was an unpardonable blunder; that the encouragement lent, first to Villa and later to Carranza, was as reprehensible as it had been futile. But whether these views are accepted or rejected, the fact remains that the Wilson policy is heading the United States towards war as unerringly as the bullet seeks its mark.

And every day of "watchful waiting" and "deadly drifting" only brings the conflict one day nearer. More than thirty Americans and 300 Haytiens and Santo Domingans have been killed during the Wilson interventions, while both countries are still occupied by the military forces of the United States.

TRACTION ROADS TO BE INSPECTED

Semi-Annual Trip Will Be Made by the Street Car Officials This Week.

FAIRMONT, Oct. 16.—The semi-annual inspection of the holdings of the Monongahela Valley Traction Company in the way of electrical railways will be made by the officials of the company on Wednesday and Thursday of this week.

A special car will leave Fairmont Wednesday morning traversing the line to Clarksburg. The party will inspect the lines from that city to Bridgeport and to Norwood and return and thence to Weston.

At Weston the new terminal station will be the center of interest. This fine building now under construction is one of the most imposing in the capital of Lewis county. It is situated on Main street. The walls of the structure are completed and will soon be under roof. It is something of which the people of West Virginia feel proud.

On returning to Clarksburg the party will make a thorough investigation of the new terminal station there. This is a building of vast proportions and the construction work is progressing nicely. Another new piece of work to be inspected will be the limestone cutoff to O'Neal. This is a new road over which regular service was installed Friday morning.

Returning toward Fairmont a stop will be made at Gypsy to look over the ground for some proposed improvements and to inspect the power plant. Coming farther on the party will go over the Lumberport extension.

The party will then proceed to the Hutchinson power plant where a considerable amount of work has been done since the last inspection. The special car will return to Fairmont about six o'clock.

Thursday a special car will carry the inspection party to Ida May and Carolina. The Western Maryland railroad to these mining centers has been electrified by the Monongahela

YES, "ON THE RUN"


