

Continuing, Benson said at Philadelphia, talking almost exclusively to a large crowd of working people: "In college, Mr. Wilson didn't need your votes, he called the labor unionists and workers unprofitable servants."

And all laborers should not forget that Wilson went even further than this in the Adamson bill recommendations, for he attached to that a recommendation that Congress pass—and he has promised that Congress will pass at the next session—a bill which gives to the president of the United States the power to put into uniform, when the occasion demands, all trainmen in this country, and make them serve as an adjunct of the army, whether other citizens are called to arms or not.

Aside from all heated argument, now in a presidential campaign, labor unions have lost much of their power in surrendering their power to Congress, and if they re-elect Woodrow Wilson and surrender the balance to the president, the laboring man's union card will not mean so much to him as it has meant to him in the past.

TAKE NOTICE: That at a legal meeting of the Board of Education of Coal District, Harrison County, West Virginia, held in said district on the 2nd day of October, 1916, the following order was adopted and entered of record, to-wit:

WHEREAS, it appearing to the said Board of Education of Coal District, Harrison County, West Virginia, that in order to provide room for, and age residing in said district, it is necessary for said Board of Education to borrow the sum of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) and issue bonds therefor for the purpose of building, remodeling, enlarging, repairing and furnishing, as hereinafter mentioned and specified, school houses in said district.
