WILL WIN WITH A GREAT SWEEP

Declares Chairman Gains about Republican Candidates in This State.

"We will win in West Virginia with a sweep which will astonish those not closely in touch with the working organization of this campaign, and that class of hysterically impressionable citizens who are food for the rabble-rousers in all hotly contested campaigns," declared Republican State Chairman Joseph Holt Gaines Monday. Chairman Gaines had just reached his hotel from his office "and the end of a perfect day," as he expressed it. He had been going over and checking up the latest reports from every county in the state, he said, with all preceding reports, and he was apparently in fine spirits over the situation.

"There has been a swing of Republicans into line," he continued, "and a diffusion of understanding among the laboring men of the fake 'eight-hour law' which was not wholly unexpected by men who have an argument that is best, and we have the right end of that argument. This campaign has been like the free-silver vagary, it got a lot of good people thinking wrong, but when they got the truth, they grasped it, and hurriedly got on the right, which is the safe, side of that issue of errant demagoguery.

"It's all over but the shouting. Our advices are splendid. The farmers of the state are, as usual, on solid ground and are with us. The laboring men have seen and are seeing the light. They are awakening to the fact that Wilson is too new a professed friend to be trusted, and Senator Watson and his personal candidate, Mr. Cornwell, have been the open enemies of the laboring people of this state, as their official records and business histories so plainly prove.

"We have the Democrats on the run. We have backed them off the hustings with just the plain, unvarnished truth. We have nothing to fear from the Democratic party as

it is now manned and directed, except the fund which they have raised to use at the voting precincts. This we know is large, and that it is the intention to use it to corrupt the electorate. We are not oblivious to that danger, and our people everywhere have been warned. When they have failed to beat us in other ways, I feel confident that they can not do it with money. There are too many honest, incorruptible voters in the state to allow that sort of thing to triumph."

This was a busy day at Republican state headquarters. As usual, in state campaigns, the Republicans have outclassed their opponents with organization. It is thorough and business like.

National Committeeman Highland, who went over reports from every voting precinct, declared that Hughes and the entire ticket will win a great victory. "Our reports show that there is absolute unity between the parts of the party which split in 1912. A Workingman Speaks

Reminds His Co-workers of the Conditions Existing Before the Outbreak of War.

A well known local workingman, discussing conditions as they existed in the year preceding the outbreak of the European war, told a representative of the Telegram that he knew from "personal experience that had not the European conflict broke out when it did there would today be more idle men in the country than ever before in history."

"Continuing, he said: "Some of the men who work with me are Democrats, but about half of them have decided to vote for Hughes this year. The others talk about prosperity and claim that the credit should be given to the Democratic administration. They forget, or pretend to, the conditions that prevailed in the year preceding the outbreak of war, when the Underwood tariff law was in effect. The country was being flooded with the products of Europe's dollars-a-day labor, and the government was deriving little or no revenue from the importation of these products. In addition to receiving a reduction in wages and being threatened with loss of my job, because of this condition, I, and others in my trade, had to pay extra taxes to fill the coffers of the depleted treasury. It is true that the taxes were said by administration leaders to have been caused by the war, but nobody was deceived by those statements. Everybody knew that the money was used to replace the cus-
