

# INPAIRED NAVY UNDER DANIELS CAMPAIGN ISSUE

"A Vote for Wilson is a Vote for Secretary of the Navy Daniels."

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25.—"A vote for Wilson is a vote for Daniels." This is one of the most frequently heard battle cries of the present presidential campaign. It is not, however, the slogan of a proud, a self-glorifying Democracy. It is a Republican warning to voters.

upon the production of efficient fighting units, Mr. Daniels thus disclosed his chief source of pride in his work; "The most thankful day of my service as secretary was the day when the committee decided to increase the number of chaplains from twenty-four to fifty-two."

There are those who hoped for the sake of the navy and the nation that Daniels could be goaded into resigning, but they now despair. "I am not the resigning kind," he chuckled in response to an inquiry at one time by a newspaper correspondent.

"His 'Educational' Program." One of the principal aims in his administration Mr. Daniels described in these words: "My great ambition is to make the navy a great university, with college extension, high school extension, and primary extension, all on board ship. The chief lack in the navy is a systematic and proper instruction of the young men who enlist."

So Mr. Daniels, pacifist, politician and Bryantite, is rounding out four years of management of the nation's first line of defense, during which he has helped to set the navy back from second to fourth, if not fifth, world rank; has delayed, almost irrevocably, the construction of new ships; has put as many ships out of its into commission; has impaired the efficiency of gunnery and navigation; has injured discipline and morale; has rewarded toadying officers and punished independent officers who held the best interests of the navy at heart; has played "pork barrel" politics, and generally has either supported or misrepresented the facts concerning the true condition of the nation's sea forces.

Decreases Battle Efficiency. Admiral Fletcher's evidence is that today only eighteen battleships could possibly go to war, and that to obtain the men to man them it would be necessary to strip their essential auxiliaries, thus decreasing the battle efficiency of the whole effective fleet.

fast light cruisers. Limitation of mobility and seagoing qualities of submarines. Lack of aircraft. Lack of radio direction finder. Too frequent overhaul of battleships. Failure to mobilize ships in reserve annually. Lack of target practice at long range. Lack of adequate facilities at fleet rendezvous. Lack of division commanders for auxiliary divisions. Low speed of warships. Lack of anti-aircraft guns.

The dangerous conditions of the navy due to insufficient personnel was persistently scouted by Daniels. Admiral Fiske complained that he had only twelve battleships in service. Admiral Fiske said that twelve ships in the recent war game had less than forty per cent of the quota of regular officers. Mr. Daniels put one new battleship into service by the simple expedient of stripping two others of their officers and men and sending the ships into the inactive list.

The record shows that no fewer than eight battleships, none over ten years old and theoretically all good for ten years' more service, were withdrawn and sent into reserve in order that their combined personnel might be used for commissioning the Pennsylvania, Oklahoma and Nevada.

Here are eleven battleships which are now rotting from disuse because the administration has failed to man them: Louisiana, Virginia, Georgia, New Jersey, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Alabama, Maine, Kearsarge, Illinois and Kentucky.

Admiral Fiske declared the navy, as a result of negligence in maintaining the standard, could not be an effective fighting force for five years. And Admiral Fiske, because his utterances were not politically pleas-


ing, was muzzled. Always before this a navy secretary has sought to get the most possible. Mr. Daniels has sought to get as little as possible. In his first year he asked for only fourteen ships, and even a Democratic Congress, penurious as it was in matters of national welfare, insisted on giving him eighteen. In his second year, with the European war in progress, he asked for only eleven submarines in the two years and a pacifist Congress made him take twenty-seven.

Obsolete Equipment. . . . While Mr. Daniels was "reforming" the navy the battleship fleet was equipped with obsolete torpedoes and the submarines were in no condition for service. He issued a statement so worded that the public and Congress were led to believe the undersea boats had made the long cruise from Florida to Sandy Hook under their own power. He boasted of the extraordinary feat. It became known, however, that only part of the flotilla had started from Florida. The others started from Hampton roads. Several gave out and literally had to be towed "into action."

A special board of the navy recommended the abandonment of the government's Mare Island navy yard, pointing out that there is not sufficient draft for the great battleships in that section of San Francisco bay. However, when the new ship California was to be built the need of pleasing California voters induced the administration to order the great ship built there. It is now about two per cent completed. When the California is nearer completion the government will either have to haul it elsewhere for adding the heavy armament or will have to spend several million dollars dredging a new channel.

"Pork Barrel" Harbor. Charleston harbor, which is constantly being improved by the southern pork hunters, has only thirty-two feet draft at high tide. A battleship needs thirty-five. Yet not only is there now a battleship drydock in Charleston harbor, but Secretary Daniels personally recommended spending more on the harbor. For Norfolk he has been demanding a drydock, opposing mean-

time a drydock at Philadelphia. The only way the naval committee could get the one at Philadelphia was to recommend two drydocks—only one of which is needed. Yet work has dragged for years on the 1913 battleships.

On December 3, 1914, Captain Mark Bristol testified that before the war opened France had twenty-two Russia, eighteen dirigibles, 800 aeroplanes; Great Britain, nine dirigibles, 400 aeroplanes; Germany, forty dirigibles, 1,000 aeroplanes; Austria, eight dirigibles, 400 aeroplanes. Even Serbia had sixty aeroplanes; Belgium had 100 and two dirigibles. The United States had no dirigibles and only twenty-three aeroplanes.
