Movement Whereby Merchants and Growers May Stiffen the Market.

AGAINST CONSIGNING EAST.

By Holding the California Product It May Be Made to Control.

The dried fruit season is marked by a strong movement among local commission men to prevent the waste of values. It is urged that under will promise the grower is apt to consign his crop to Eastern houses, which simply reimburse themselves and disregard the true home interests of the consignor.

We believe the loss to the producer heretofore has been to a great extent, due to consignment to Eastern houses, which have with whom parties shipping are entirely unacquainted. There should be a better feeling of confidence between the grower and the San Francisco fruit houses and the producer.

It is urged by the commission men that the great point to be gained is the establishment of more confidence between home growers and home commission houses, California, they say, might easily control the dried fruit market.

Another authority on tobacco has said that the dried fruit is dumped on the Eastern market at the wrong season, and the home grower is altogether at the mercy of the Eastern buyer.

To give you an idea how the business has been transacted through the East, I have just learned of a broker here who visited our State and solicited consignments of 50 per cent of the crop.

It also appears that a great deal of this consigning to the East is done by local commission men themselves. Some of these men make heavy profits on the consigning, and for this reason they are unable to wait for, and therefore the fruit is sacrificed simply to return the amount of their advances and the commission.

It is hoped by the local merchants that the discussion of the consigning question will result in some better understanding between commission men and growers for their mutual benefit.

NEW TRUSTEES AND FACULTY.
