FIVE INQUESTS.

Bartlett Said Mrs. Mabel Wilson Told Him She Intended to Commit Suicide Because of Him.

Five inquests were held by Coroner Hawkins yesterday.

In the cases of Mrs. Mabel Wilson, who poisoned herself because her lover, Albert E. Bartlett, had abandoned her; Rolf J. Rolfsen, the Bay-street inventor who shot himself because of domestic troubles; Phillip Button, the Polk-street cigar dealer who cut his throat; and Hugo Fraunholz, the brewer who shot himself in the City House.

Bartlett testified that the Mrs. Mabel Wilson intended to commit suicide because she was going to commit suicide because he would not live with her, and he said he tried to dissuade her from her purpose.
