LYMAN J. GAGE'S SUCCESSOR.

S. M. Nickerson Elected President of the First National Bank.

CHICAGO, ILL., Feb. 11.—A meeting of the directors of the First National Bank, held this afternoon, S. M. Nickerson, one of the heaviest stockholders of the bank, was elected president in place of Lyman J. Gage, who resigned to accept the portfolio of Secretary of the Treasury in McKinley's cabinet.

George D. Boutwell, who has been with the bank for thirty-three years, was appointed second vice-president in place of J. B. Fergan, who was elected to the first vice-presidency, and whom, it is understood, will be the real executive chief of the institution at the salary paid Mr. Gage.

Mr. Boutwell will continue to have charge of the foreign exchange department. It is expected that Mr. Gage has his friends and some colleagues to understand that severing his connection with the bank he did so for all time. The constitutional provision requires the resignation of the Secretary to have no interest whatever in the bank.
