

Mr. Hamlin, formerly Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, was an excellent man to go up there and take final observations. He has been there and he is now on his way here. He has telegraphed me from Denver saying he would arrive here Saturday night and he asked me to meet him here, which I will do.
