If the Irish members of Parliament believed that their country had been wronged it was their duty the time the Jubilee cry went up from the English people to strike the discordant note. They would have been wise to their trust and less than men if they had not refused to partake in the jubilee of a government which has been worse for them than war, pestilence and famine combined. During the whole reign of Victoria, year after year, the population of Ireland has been getting less.
