Old Thomas Duffy Kills Rancher Russell of Rosedale.

Defends Himself With a Knife From an Attack by His Employer.

Says He Was Set Upon and Belabored Because He Broke a Scantling.

BAKERSFIELD, CAL., Sept. 6.—Thomas Duffy stabbed to death Martin Russell this afternoon on the latter's ranch, about nine miles west of here, in the Rosedale Colony.

After the noon meal Russell, when he went to work, found on reaching the stack that a scantling had been used when the stack was broken in two.

When Duffy arose he told Russell that he did not want any trouble, and asked that he give him his set upon him with the scantling, beating him over the head.

When Duffy was sent for, he now has a full head, face and shoulders were bruised and bleeding.

This is Duffy's version of the affair, and only himself and Russell were present during the fracas.
