REACHING FOR ALASKA TRADE

Efforts to Have Dyea Deprived of Sub-Port Privileges.

Many Vessels on the Way to This Coast for Northern Business.

Several Large Klondike Parties in Texas Will Outfit in San Francisco.

The efforts of the Alaska trade committee are meeting with more success every day. The committee members who are canvassing for collections say that the merchants generally express satisfaction at the progress of the work.

The Pacific Steam Whaling Company already has semi-monthly steamers regularly on the route from San Francisco only. The Pacific Coast Steamship Company sends out a large steamer every five days and promises to put on more when required.

The Alaska Transportation Company of San Francisco and New York is building three steamers at the Fulton Iron Works, San Francisco, and has purchased and paid for two other vessels in Philadelphia.

The Cramp Steamship Company of Philadelphia will have five large vessels sailing from San Francisco early in the spring, and numerous other companies whose announcements have not been definitely made are in the market, so that no matter how great the rush every one can secure passage promptly.

Yesterday the committee was very active in the work of having Dyea closed as a sub-port of entry, and the following telegram has been sent to the Chamber of Commerce at Seattle, Portland and Tacoma by the Chamber of Commerce and Board of Trade here:

Will you join us in expense of sending first-class mail to Washington on Dyea matter. Expenses will not exceed \$10,000.

Victoria people are using the fact that there is a duty on goods to the disadvantage of American interests, as they advertise that there is a customs duty of 25 per cent on American goods, and that miners are stopped at Dyea and compelled to chop wood and do other work to pay their duty. This is not a fact.

Evening schooners are already chartered from New York to this point, and three brig and three steamers, all bound for Alaska and to touch here.

Rooms in Chicago. CHICAGO, Dec. 7.—Offices of the Alaska Trade Committee will be opened in Chicago within a few days. For this purpose \$50,000 has been raised, which will be expended in placing before the public the merits of the Golden Gate, with a view to inducing them to go through San Francisco on their way to the gold fields.

Atlantic-Yukon Transportation Company, arrived to-day and will be in charge of the work here, assisted by H. H. Sherwood, D. M. Carmen and E. Engleberg, all well-known San Francisco business men. Partial arrangements have been made by him for a Clark-street storehouse, where also will be displayed sample outfits suitable for far northern regions.
