FOUR CHOICES WIN HANDILY

SAM MCKEEVER RUNS A FAST SIX FURLONGS.

Miss Rowena Beaten by Rubicon. Napamex Given a Hard Tussle.

The lusty "northeaster" that left a trail behind of leveled fences, fallen trees and twisted and bent signs and awnings did not overlook the Oakland track. About 6 o'clock yesterday morning a particularly strong and healthy gust whisked underneath the long wooden covering leading from the railroad to the grand stand, completely demolishing it. The icy breath of the wind swept the jockeys shivering during the afternoon, and blowing strongly down the back stretch, prevented any fast time being accomplished. The fields were all light, and the fates were kind to horses carrying the public money. Four of the six favorites landed first at the wire. The crowd was not large, and the ring did not present a very animated appearance.

The opening sprint for 2-year-olds was captured by Faversham, second choice in the betting. Silver Beau, the favorite, led until within a few yards of the wire, where Bullman greyed and was beaten out half a length. Show honors went to G. E. Deere.

Recreation was introduced to some cheap ones in the mile purse run. At the finish, starting at 7 to 10, the favorite, the Rosmond and Guller took simple. The mile was covered in 1:42.

On the 2-year-old event at six furlongs was very brisk and the wise ones again overlooked Sam McKeever. The ring checked up the head of the Montana colt, which was later rubbed to 3. He skinned along with Gauntlet and the favorite, Silver Beau, but he was not in the stretch, when he gradually forged to the front, winning easily in the fast time of 1:14. A mild breeze, Limewater got the pie from Olinthus.

The mile and a furlong run went to Napamex. The Maxim billy ruled a pronounced favorite in the betting, and won with little in reserve. She was early challenged by Morellito with "Skeets" Martin in the saddle, but she held her ground and Johnny Woods landed his mount first by a neck in 1:53, a remarkably good performance.

The fast and consistent Miss Rowena was asked to concede too many pounds to Rubicon in the mile and a furlong. She was favored fifth on the card, and met defeat. She was favored throughout the betting, and in a hard drive was led out at the head by Laigan's big horse, Bellicoso showed some speed, finishing third.

It was something like one of his old-time runs that McKeever put up at the concluding six-furlong event. A 9 to 10 favorite, Thorpe soon had him in front, and won at pleasure from the 49 to 1 shot Fly.

INHUMAN TREATMENT OF HELPLESS FOWLS

DOZENS OF TURKEYS PLUCKED ALIVE IN CLOVERDALE.

A Weight With a Hook Attached Fastened Into the Birds to Prevent Struggling.

The officers of Cruelty to Animals have received a complaint of what, if true, is a most atrocious case of cruelty. A gentleman from Cloverdale visited the office yesterday and stated that just before the Thanksgiving season he had seen a number of turkeys being plucked in Cloverdale plucked several hundred of these birds in a most inhuman manner. The birds were hung by their legs and their necks stretched by heavy weight attached to a hook, fastened into the turkey's mouth. While still alive, in fact without any attempt being made to put the poor creatures out of their misery, the fowls were cleanly plucked of all their feathers. The reason for plucking them alive was because the feathers come out much easier. The object of weighting them was to render the suffering birds so helpless that they could not flutter and interfere with the plucking.

It is asserted that unless something is done before the coming holiday the cruel-ty will be repeated. The informant, being a resident of Cloverdale, does not wish to be known, but in the event of the case being brought to the attention of the society and if he can secure sufficient evidence of the cruelty, he will prosecute the offenders under the State laws. In the case where he carried out the turkeys of cruelty to calves to a successful issue, and caused the punishment of the human butchers.

CUPID COMPLAINS OF DULL BUSINESS

The New Woman and Other Innovations Are Ruining His Trade.

THE hard working business man is not the only party complaining present trade conditions with what has been. Out in the City Hall, the once active and tireless Cupid has been running over for people to enter into a state of wedlock and trust to Providence. For the same period ending July 1, 1897, the certificates issued aggregated the discouraging total of 2674, making a falling off of 61. Think of it. There were 1302 people who did not afford me an opportunity to make them happy. Of course, there might have been many grass widows and widowers in the number, in which case the area of happiness would have covered a wider scope.

Some people might have difficulty in accounting for these conditions, but I do not find the solution troublesome owing to the fact that I have made a study of the question. I find several reasons for the situation. First, the long-continued dull times that came in 1893. Second, the falling off in the demand for labor; and third, the heavy re-

duction of salaries. Out of these conditions came a new state of affairs. The young men were not only unable to marry, but the young women stepped in and took their places, working for less wages and doubtless performing their duties just as well as their lords of creation had previously done. This made the girls independent and ambitious—the men helpless and discouraged.

Therefore what could the poor boys do but stay single and bemoan their fate? These are the main reasons for the present untoward conditions which I fear will prevail for a long time to come.

There is another matter that is doing serious and unnecessary injury to Cupid's business in this city, and that is the new law under which a man is not permitted to marry in this State within one year. Why, in the past year this senseless regulation has driven hundreds of our citizens to Reno, Nev., to get married. It has been a snap for the railroad and a boon

to the preachers and Justices of the Peace of the Sagebrush town. That is not a protective tariff for drivers business away from home and does not accomplish the purpose for which it was enacted, to prevent marriage under certain circumstances.

Yes, we are selling a few permits to commit matrimony, but the cash result is not satisfactory and the Lord knows when it will be.

AMATEUR ATHLETES.

Academic League Will Hold a Swimming Tournament Next Week at the Lurline Baths.

At the regular monthly meeting of the Pacific Association of the Amateur Athletic Union, held last night in this city, W. H. Berry of Reliance offered his resignation as president of the association, but the motion was not carried. An application from the Columbia Park Boys' Club of Emanuel El Sisterhood for admission to the association was favorably received. On sending copies of their constitution and by laws to the association the Boys' Club will be admitted to membership. Messrs. ALASKA RAILROAD.

Work Progressing Rapidly on the White Pass and Yukon Line.

Charles R. Hansen of 104 Geary street is in receipt of a letter from Hugh Foy, superintendent of the Pacific Contract Company, which is building the White Pass and Yukon Railway, running from Skagway to Fort Selkirk, Alaska, in which he says that work on the road has reached White Pass. It is the intention of the company to keep a force of laborers at work all winter and next summer it is expected that 2000 men will be employed.

Mr. Hansen has already sent several hundred men to Skagway and will continue to do so as fast as they present themselves. The fare has been reduced from \$31 to \$12 50 and it is thought that many will avail themselves of one of the best opportunities offered in years for railroad laborers to lay up a snug fortune.

The work is progressing much faster than expected. It is expected that the White Pass and Yukon line will be completed in less than 18 months. The weather will be no bar to the work. GOODS TO BE SENT BY WAY OF THE SUEZ CANAL

Two Big Transports to Be Used.

LARGEST IN THE EAST

NEW YORK TROOPS WERE WELL TREATED IN HONOLULU.

Pay Day Gladdens the Hearts of the Sixth California and Battery I, Third Artillery—Presidio Notes.

A dispatch from Washington says the War Department has in contemplation the use of the two big transports now being fitted out at Cramps for the conveyance of troops on the Pacific service. It is said that when they have served their purpose in conveying the permanent garrisons to Cuba they will be dispatched to Manila by way of the Suez Canal. In such case they will take several thousand troops to replace the volunteers there. After that the Mississippi and her sister ship will ply between Manila and San Francisco, supplementing the transport service now operated by the Government.

They can be easily spared from the Atlantic coast after the Cuban garrisons are once established, in view of the small demands for transportation in that quarter, as compared with the prospective demands in the Philippines. These vessels, like the Mobile, will each afford accommodations for 2400 troops, and the ship's space, it is said, the War Department has been so well divided that the individual soldiers will be much more comfortable than would half the number aboard.
