

GUALALUION THE HANDICAP AT OAKLAND Led Mary Black Over the Line.

TWO FAVORITES IN FRONT FLOWER OF GOLD HAS A PROMISING FUTURE.

Montanus Took the Opening Event at Long Odds—Winifred Was Overlooked—Frank Jaubert Finally Scored.

A raged-looking mare, with here and there a digestive racing morsel, caused the betting to drag along in a drowsy manner at Oakland yesterday.

The plugging was confined among the layers of odds themselves, from heat and other causes the favorites suffered terribly, two only getting to the wire first.

The six furlong handicap had some presumptions to class, with Mary Black, Rubicon and Gualaluion among the starters.

The first named mare was installed favorite in the books, but Gualaluion led almost from the start, leading the first choice out half a length in 1:14.

The fast filly Maud Ferguson was installed an odds-on choice for the first race, but she has lost all form, and was replaced by Winifred.

The stretch Ivy Powell landed the 12 to 1 shot, Montanus a handy winner. Carter Harrison at no stage of the running showed any speed.

On the strength of his showing made in a handicap some days ago, Montanus was looked upon as a money horse for the mile and a furlong sailing affair.

Opening an even money chance, he receded to 7 to 5 and then finished third. Winifred, the Corrigan entry, was away first and never headed won cleverly from Rapid.

The winner was numerous scratches in the two-year-old scramble, making it look a certainty for Flower of Gold, with Jones in the saddle.

The filly had a pronounced call in the betting and spreadgair among the fanciers. Rachel C. was going away at odds on the place from Loch Katrine by a nose.

A big field of sixteen maidens started in the fourth event, and five and a half furlongs Tillamore closed a slight favorite over Soliman, and the pair fought it out.

Nearing the wire the latter tried to beat the fast coming Henry C. a half length.

The 15 to 1 shot, Cavallo, came very near getting the verdict in the second mile and a furlong race. Indeed, many thought he did win.

After making the race from the start, he was overtaken by a rush nearing the wire and was given the verdict. The latter was heavily backed, while Cavallo was practically friendless.
