

GROANS GREET A DECISION AT OAKLAND

Ingleside Exiles Disgust the Crowd.

DARE II WAS DISQUALIFIED AFTER WINNING IN A BIG GALLOP.

Reopening Day of the Pacific Coast Jockey Club—Flimsy Sport That Failed to Please. Devereux Backed.

The exiled Pacific Coast Jockey Club now holds possession of the Oakland race track. Yesterday the Ingleside association commenced what will be the closing meeting of the racing season.

One day during the preceding meeting of the club named Pat Morrissey won a race and was disqualified in favor of the Corigan entry, Adolph Spreckels.

Personne finishing second, Corigan furnished the 2 to 10 favorite Sardonio, which ran fourth. At the stretch the bumping was caused by "Colonel Roosevelt" Piggott on the favorite and Macklin, with the aid on Red Glenn.

A carefully planned coup was executed in the two-year-old event. Devereux, a colt by Puryer D-Grizelda, with Jenkins on his back, and backed from 20 down to 1, won impressively from the big youngsters.

With Peltotto scratched from the introductory event, a mile selling run, Social, the mount of the favorite, was scratched.

AFTER an honorable career of twenty-seven years as professor of chemistry in the Pharmaceutical College, William T. Wenzell has resigned.

His threescore years and ten rest heavily on the educator, and he has appeared either in the classroom or on the lecture platform for the greater part of his life.

Back of the resignation of Professor Wenzell is a story of the disaffection of the junior class at the College of Pharmacy and of friction between the professor and his pupils.

The dean of the college, William M. Searby, speaks highly of Professor Wenzell. "He is one of the oldest and most highly respected instructors on the Pacific Coast," says Mr. Searby.
