

The Government's best official information is that Vice President Figueroa, who has assumed control, has the support of all of the substantial people of the island.

They do not anticipate that filibustering expeditions will be fitted out in this country. The danger points are in Cuba and Hayti.

CLEVELAND STRIKERS DESPERATE

Former Conductor Arrested on a Charge of Using Dynamite.

CLEVELAND, Aug. 2. It is said that Governor Bushnell will come to Cleveland in person shortly to investigate the situation and to decide how long the troops shall be kept here.

CLEVELAND, Aug. 2.—The police believe they have made an arrest which may lead to important developments in connection with several attempts to blow up Big Consolidated cars since the beginning of the present strike.
