

THE COLUMBIA QUEEN OF ALL SAILING CRAFT Splendid Race Off Long Island.

NEW YACHT FAR IN FRONT LOSES ALL COMPETITORS BUT THE DEFENDER.

Result of New York Yacht Club's First Run Indicates That the Shamrock Will Be Beaten by the American.

GREENPORT, L. I., Aug. 8.—The first run of the New York Yacht Club to-day from New London out into the sound as far as Watch Hill and back to Gardiners Bay was one of the most successful in the club's history.

Over fifty yachts crossed the line at New London and nearly all finished in Gardiners Bay, although some of them did not get in until toward night.

The run gave the yachts a good broad reach to Race Rock of three and a half miles, a fine run before the wind to Watch Hill of eight miles and a grand beat of eight and a quarter miles to the finish.


By far the greatest event of the day was the magnificent race between the Columbia from Fishers Island to Great Gulf Island, during which she averaged close to a thirty-mile an hour.
