WILL PROCEED TO MANILA BELONG TO FORTY-SECOND SOLDIERS OF COMPANY K ARE STRICKEN WHILE AT DRILL.

Rev. Father William D. McKinnon arrived in the city yesterday after a six weeks' visit to Washington, D. C., and other large Eastern cities. Father McKinnon was recently appointed chaplain of the regular army by the President and has been ordered to proceed to Manila and report to Commanding General Otis for assignment to one of the regiments now stationed in the Philippines. He will reside with his mother at 1899 Steiner street until the time for his departure, which has been fixed for December 1st.
