CONFLAGRATION IN FACTORY DISTRICT

Yosemite Flour Mills and the California Paste Factory Destroyed—Live Wires Seriously Hamper Work of Firemen—\$250,000 Loss.



ONE of the most spectacular conflagrations that has occurred in this city since the Baldwin fire called out the department at 8 o'clock last evening, the Yosemite Flour Mills, the building occupied by the California-Italian Paste Company and the Custom Grain and Feed Mills and several smaller structures on Bryant street, between Seventh and Eighth, were consumed. The loss is estimated at \$250,000, and owing to high rates of insurance was carried on the property.
