CITIZENS DEMAND THAT DYER RESIGN.

Mass Meeting Held in Palo Alto to Protest Against the Disposal of a Chinese Girl.

Special Dispatch to the Call. PALO ALTO, March 31.—The people of Palo Alto held a rousing indignation meeting to-night and denounced Justice Edgar G. Dyer and Night Watchman Dunsmore for the part they are alleged to have played in turning a rescued Chinese girl over to the hands of those who would return her to a life of shame and bondage.

Long before the time advertised for the meeting Northey Hall was crowded to the doors. Two hundred Stanford students marched in a body from the campus over to the hall, shouting denunciations of Dyer and Dunsmore all the way. The meeting commenced its serious work by electing Samuel J. Brun chairman and Professor Elmer E. Smith secretary.

Miss Cameron, the superintendent of the San Francisco Mission Home from which the Chinese girl was taken, was then called upon to state her knowledge of the case. Two hours she did in a simple, straightforward manner. The whole story from the time Constable Harris appeared in San Francisco until Judge Ely's warrant against two highbinders until the girl was wrested from her possession by Watchman Dunsmore at the Palo Alto jail was related substantially as it appeared in this morning's paper. Gilbert Wigle, attorney for Mrs. Cameron, stated that he asked Dyer to see the docket book in which the entry of the supposed trial and conviction of the Chinese girl was recorded, and that no such entry had been made.

Chairman Brun then stated that inasmuch as the object of the meeting was to see that fair play was done toward all concerned, he would grant the floor to either Judge Ely or Watchman Dunsmore to clear up the facts of the case, or any of their friends who might wish to speak in their defense. But neither of the aforementioned persons was in the hall nor had any one a word to say in explanation of their conduct.

A committee, consisting of Messrs. Gardner, Butler, Hall, Baile, Whittier and Schwartzkopf, who were appointed by the chair, proposed resolutions sympathizing with Miss Cameron, requesting Dyer to resign his office, Justice of the Peace, and requesting the District Attorney to bring such criminal action against Dyer, Hinch and Dunsmore as the facts warranted. The resolutions were passed with cheers, not a dissenting voice being heard. It is expected that criminal proceedings will be immediately brought against the accused parties, as public sentiment in Palo Alto is demanding it. E. G. Dyer, the accused Justice, is a graduate of Michigan University and comes from a prominent family, with whom he has resided in Palo Alto for a number of years.

Brakeman Injured. Special Dispatch to the Call. RAYMOND, March 31.—C. H. Dahms, a young brakeman, was accidentally caught between the engine and a freight car while switching in the railroad yard here this morning and was seriously hurt. The injured man was taken on a special train to Berenda, where Dr. Byers, the railroad physician, was in waiting to attend him. Upon examination it was found that the coupling link had inflicted a serious wound on his right leg.
