OAKLAND, May 6.—Henry Weinstock of Sacramento lectured this evening at the First Unitarian Church under the auspices of the Starr-King fraternity. His subject was "The Purification of a City."

"Never before in the history of civilization has a nation, without war or unholy conquest, attained such vast wealth and gained such pre-eminence in the world as in so brief a time as have the American people. No people have ever proven themselves better fitted for self-government or better prepared to meet the problems of a modern state than the American people."
