



IN SAUCES

Figure That Edwards Will Have Votes to Spare Monday.

Bea Forces Will Not Yield Easily and Are Working Day and Night to Herd in Doubtful Ones.

SAN JOSE, May 18.—Interest in the city election is increasing, and the acquisition of the Edwards force during the past few days indicate an overwhelming victory for the Citizens' ticket. Systematic work of the Committee of One Hundred has caused hundreds of voters to join the reform movement, while no increase can be figured out of Bea's ranks of voters.

Unless all signs fall Edwards should win by at least 400 majority. This is accounted for thus: In the charter fight two years ago, Martin only defeated Smith, the Charter and nominee, by 400 votes. Edwards will get the Smith vote almost in toto, and added to this will be the good count of the support of the endorsement of the Pastors' Union and churches and the Jacksonian Democratic League.

Another fighting force against the present administration is the Colomбетtes. When the Treasurer Evans resigned, Mayor Martin named Joseph Colomбет as his successor.

REGRETS NOT HAVING TAKEN MORE LIVES

Confession Made by the Man Who Committed Seven Murders on the Prinz Carl.

STOCKHOLM, May 18.—A dispatch received here to-day from Eskilstava says that Philip Nordlund, who was arrested there, has now fully confessed that he deliberately planned the crimes committed on board the steamer Prinz Carl on Wednesday night, when he murdered seven men and wounded five others, a woman and a boy, after which he escaped in a boat at Kopling.

INCREASED INFUX OF JAPANESE LIKELY
