


Rev. F. M. Royall, a Missionary, Arrives From Shantung, China.

THEOPHILE GARNIER MISSING FROM HOME

Had Become Melancholy and Flighty Since He Recovered From Dangerous Sickness. Leon Gustave Garnier of 821 Pine street called at the Coroner's office yesterday afternoon and reported his brother, Theophile Eliacin Garnier, missing.

Theophile had recently recovered from a severe attack of typhoid fever and became very melancholy. At times he did not appear to be perfectly sane. He borrowed 50 cents from his brother last Monday morning and that was the last seen or heard of him.

The missing man is about 5 feet 9 inches tall, 150 pounds weight and has black eyes, hair and mustache and dark complexion. He wore a white Fedora hat and a dark blue suit of clothes.
