SITUATION IN CARBON'S STRIKE MUCH IMPROVED

Cars Are Now in Operation on All Lines Throughout the City.

ST. LOUIS, June 12.—There were no important developments in the street car strike situation today.

More men are now employed by the company than there is work for them to do, according to General Manager Baumhoff, and not only is the force being constantly increased by men coming from other cities but from the ranks of the strikers themselves.

To-night cars are running on all lines on about the same schedule as last night. Lines to the north and south are guarded by police, but in the central and western portions there was no trouble.

The Mayor's proclamation, which is the strengthening of the forces along the southwestern and southern divisions of the street car line is in operation to-night for the first time since the strike was inaugurated.


