

The two schools to receive this recognition of their merit are the San Jose College, with its attached academy, and the College of Notre Dame in this city. The San Jose College is accredited in English, Latin, French, mathematics and history, and essential courses in primary education.

The meeting was a spirited one, during the course of which a movement was started for the formation of an alumnae association. A report of the work of graduates for the past year showed that the majority of them were pursuing a higher course in the different colleges. The committee having the reunion in charge consisted of Miss Violette, Miss Anna Bennett, Miss Bickie Hess and Miss Beatrix Cooley.

The Civil Service Commission has adopted the rules to govern the marking of papers in the examination for ordinary clerks to be held June 15. The following are the subjects and their relative weights: Arithmetic, 4; copying from rough draft, 2; letter writing, 2; experience, 2. The board's circular says: "Each competitor will be required to write a letter of the least one hundred words on a subject pertaining to the city government, which will be announced at the examination. Deductions will be made for poor penmanship, want of neatness, departure from subject, each defect in form or address for each error in spelling. In arithmetic ten credits will be given for each of the ten problems answered. Deductions will be made for each error in copying figures from question sheet, each error in decimal point and for fractions in answer not reduced to lowest terms. Copying from rough draft will be marked upon a scale of hundred. The mark will be determined by correctness in framing sentences, spelling and capitalization. Deductions will be made for each error in spelling, each error in spelling omitted or inserted and each error in capitalization. There will be allowed for satisfactory proof of continuous and faithful employment in clerical capacity for a period of five years, \$5; three to four, \$3; two to three, \$2; one to two, \$1.
