


PEACE OFFICERS BITE EAGERLY AT BAIT OF CLEVER BUNKO MAN

"Lay Low and Pay Charges." After paying the charges and securing possession of the package the peace officer confided to the express agent that he had received from the criminal department of the Canadian Bureau of Justice a letter requesting him to secure the express package and "lay low and watch out for one M. D. Byrnes, an absconding cashier in the office of the Bowring Steamship Company at Halifax, who had been traced to that locality. For the capture of Byrnes, of whom a complete description was given, a reward of \$250 was offered, and for the recovery of the express package an additional reward of \$200 would be paid.

Dear Sir: I wish to advise you that I am authorized to offer you a reward of two hundred and fifty dollars for the arrest of one M. D. Byrnes, who until recently lived in this city and was cashier in the office of the Bowring Steamship Company. On July 10, 1930, he absconded, after stealing thirty-two hundred (\$3200) dollars in cash and some bank warrants or certificates valued at about five thousand (\$5000) dollars. With him went a fellow clerk named Watson. We traced them to Boston, New York and Chicago, and at the latter place we captured Watson, whom we now have in prison here, and who in a re-
